North Win Inter Regional Shield

Albion Boys Club duo twin brothers Scott and Grant Hepburn gave a whole new meaning to twin strikers when they scored the first and second goals in the North's 3-1 win over the West to win the Scottish Youth FA Inter Regional Shield at 14's Age Group.

The game at Ochilview Park Stenhousemuir was goalless at halftime but the North lads raised the tempo in the second half and Grant Hepburn grabbed the first goal within five minutes of the restart. This spurred the West into action and they drew level when the North defence failed to clear.

The North's lead was restored when Hepburn number two Grant, pounced to slot the ball past the West's Keeper. The North's victory was assured when Lewis United's Murray Adam got on the end of a slick piece passing play by the North.

15'S MISS OUT ON DOUBLE

The North 15's were not able to make it a double going under 4-1 to the West. The North never got going in the first half and were a goal down and suffered the loss of Dyce BC Niall Murray through injury on the stroke of half time. The North boys did up their game in the second half but fell further behind before Cove's Robert Mathieson scored a well struck free kick from the edge of the box. The North went all out for the equaliser but as so often happens left themselves exposed at the back and they lost a third. Cruelly they lost a fourth just on time and whilst the West deserved their victory the 4-1 score line flattered them.

A special vote of thanks must be paid to the coaches of the Regional Squads. Graeme Burnett of Westdyke 17's and Gillies McDonald of Culter Deeside 14's combined the work with their own teams with that of managing the 14's squad.

Eric too has had previous experience with Regional squads at an older age group. Newcomer this year to the Regional set up was Graeme Mathieson of Cove and his assistance was greatly appreciated.

Albion 15's with the experience of last season's cup triumph are hoping to beat Syngenta in the semi finals and win a final for the second year running.

Another club with cup winning pedigree are Dyce BC 16's who are hoping to emulate their 17's triumph of 2005. But first they must dispose of Kingdom Thistle down in Fife in the semi final.

This is not the most teams that Aberdeen have had in the semi finals in 2003 no fewer than five teams made to the national semi finals .

CUP TIE RULE COMES INTO PLAY ON 31st MARCH

Clubs are reminded that only players registered before the 31st of March 2008 can play in any cup ties.

This Rule is generally known as the Cup Tie Rule and was brought in to ensure that the players who won through to the latter stages of the Cup competitions were not dropped at the expense of a player having been released from say the juniors or the senior youth initiative.

An exception to the rule is made for goalkeepers.

CUPS AND TROPHIES TO BE HANDED BACK

Clubs that were lucky enough to win a trophy last season must return them to the Association Vice President George Ferguson in a clean and presentable fashion before the 1st of April 2008.

Clubs failing to do so will be liable to a fine.

This year the Executive Committee will be closely monitoring this and fines will be imposed on defaulters!

Clubs are reminded that Aberdeen City are still offering discounted pitches when you buy a book of ten vouchers for pitch hire. Details of the application form can be found in the News Section of the Regional website at www.northernsyfa.co.uk dated 1st October.



Coaches who wish to progress should check out the Grampian Coaching Website at www.grampiancoaching.org.uk. You will find details of a Coaching Scholarship where up to 80% of coaching course fees can be granted upon application. A data base of coaches in the Grampian Area is also being set up and all coaches are encouraged to complete the questionnaire on the website.

Details will also soon be announced of a Coaching Conference pencilled in for the 4th of May. This will be open to all sports coaches in the Grampian Area. It will be an opportunity to discover best practice in fitness and motivational coaching.

Payment by Cheque

A number of club officials are paying fines with personal cheques. To further complicate matters they are not enclosing any correspondence to let the association treasurer know what it is for.

The treasurer has therefore asked that all cheques be marked on the back with the teams name and age group . Clubs should also enclose a letter letting her know what the cheque is for.

This is particularly important at this time of year when affiliation fees for next season will be paid.

REGISTRATION RULES AND REFEREES SEMINAR FOR TEAMS NEW TO COMPETITIVE FOOTBALL

The association in conjunction with the SYFA and the SFA as part of the Youth Initiative will be hosting a seminar entitled Registration Rules and Referees for all teams making the transition from the trophy free 12's to the fully competitive 13's age group.

At the seminar the registration process and the rules of the various competitions including the Scot-tiosh Cup will be explained.

A speaker from the Aberdeen and District Referees Association will explain the Laws of the Game as far as they apply to Youth Football. In particular he will explain how the referee must enforce the Laws of the Game in such instances as sending off for denying a goalscor-ing opportunities. He will explain the need for cooperation with the referees so that the young players may enjoy fully the game of football. It is recommended that all clubs send at least one member of their management committee to the Seminar which will be held on the 14th of April at Oldmachar Academy . Clubs have been sent letters with application forms . All officials attending will receive a certificate of attendance.

Clubs will also get a set of training bibs courtesy of the SFA Youth Initiative emblazoned with the logo Live it. Play it. Love it.
